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PIPELINE MILEPOST 185

I am a property owner in Monroe County, WV. I have expressed my opposition to the Mountain Valley Pipeline project – docket # PF15-6 and or CP 16-10-000 in the past. Recently FERC has granted permits for this project to go forward.

It is puzzling and infuriating that this project has been green lighted while there are many issues that have not been resolved:

- Constitutional challenges filed before the issuance of the FERC Certificate have not been resolved
- WV DEP erred in its permitting for this project in violation of State and Federal statutes on clean water
- Questionable qualification of MVP as a private concern to be granted power of eminent domain
- The contractors and sub-agents that MVP has agreements with, as sited in court testimony, are all under the same umbrella - that is, MVP is selling the gas to itself not to other entities - in potential violation of the National Gas Act

While this project has been on the drawing board for over 3 years there remain glaring issues unresolved : Constitutionality , that the agencies involved are ignoring existing statutes designed to protect the environment.

Yet, FERC is allowing MVP to rush this project into production – it does not make sense on any level except as viewed in allowing a private entity the ability to take advantage of the situation, perhaps illegally, to make a financial killing.

There needs to be a Rehearing of the Certificate Decision
